RESOLUTION # _____

A RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF PHILLIPSBURG, KANSAS APPROVING A SPECIAL EVENT KNOWN AS THE PHILLIPSBURG CHAMBER AND MAIN STREET CAR CRUISE & STREET DANCE.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF PHILLIPSBURG, KANSAS, that:

Section 1. Pursuant to state law, alcoholic liquor may be consumed at a special event to be held on designated public streets, alleys, and sidewalks when a temporary permit has been issued by the Kansas Division of Alcohol Beverage Control (ABC) and the governing body has approved the event as required by K.S.A. 41-719 and 41-2645 and amendments thereto.

Section 2. Having considered the request of the sponsor of the Phillipsburg Chamber and Main Street Car Cruise & Street Dance to allow the possession and consumption of alcoholic liquor, the governing body hereby approves the event to be held on September 17 between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 1:00 a.m., provided the sponsor secures a temporary permit from ABC and complies with all state laws and ordinances regulating alcoholic liquor.

Section 3. The following street shall be closed to motor vehicle traffic during the dates and times identified in Section 2: 400 block of F Street. Pursuant to K.S.A. 41-719 and 41-2645, the sponsor shall ensure that the area in which alcoholic liquor is possessed or consumed is clearly marked by signs, a posted map, or other means (Designated Barricaded Area).

Section 4. Event attendees may purchase, possess, and consume alcoholic beverages within the Designated Barricaded Area. Pursuant to K.S.A. 41-719, no alcoholic liquor may be removed from the Designated Barricaded Area or consumed inside vehicles while on public streets or alleys at the event.

Section 5. This resolution shall take effect and be in force after its approval by the governing body.

- MINUTES APPROVED** Moved by Stites, seconded by Voorhees, to approve the minutes of the August 1, 2016 meetings as written. Voting Aye: ALL. Opposed: NONE.
- APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE #1055-08-16A** Moved by Rogers, seconded by Speake, to approve an ordinance to pay the bills for the month of August. Voting Aye: ALL. Opposed: NONE. Statutory majority having voted for this ordinance; the city clerk assigned it ordinance #1055-08-16A.
- CITY ATTORNEY** It was the consensus of the Council for Sage to attend the annual city attorney's conference.
- COURT CONF.** Marlene Dugan will be attending the municipal court clerk fall conference.
- SIDEWALK REPLACEMENT** Chance reported a property owner had asked if their brick sidewalk would be eligible for replacement using the sidewalk program. It was the consensus of the Council the sidewalk would be eligible.

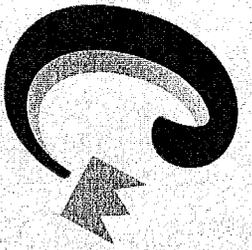

RESOLUTION ADOPTING RENTAL RATES FOR THE PHILLIPSBURG, KANSAS COMMUNITY BUILDING.

WHEREAS, the Code of the City of Phillipsburg, Kansas adopted on November 18, 2013, states all user charges, deposit fees, rules and regulations affecting the Community Building shall be set by policy of the Governing Body;

WHEREAS, the Phillipsburg City Council deems it advisable to set fees for the rental of the Community Building Gym;

WHEREAS, the HOPE Foundation is no longer operating the community building;

WHEREAS, the Community Building Club Rooms and the second story of the Community Building are not in compliance with the American Disabilities Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF PHILLIPSBURG, KANSAS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: The Community Building Club Rooms and the second story of the Community Building will not be rented to the public.

Section 2: The following will be the rental rates:

Community Building Gym - \$_____ per hour to be paid in full to the City of Phillipsburg.

Section 3: This Resolution shall be in full force and effect September 1, 2016.
