The Phillipsburg City Council met in regular session on November 21, 2016, 6:00 P.M., at the Phillipsburg City Office, 945 Second Street.

- TITLE VI            Discussion was held concerning the Title VI policy.
- AIRPORT            It was the consensus of the Council to not purchase the airport hangar from Dustin Cheney.

- PUBLIC WORKS Driggs reported on activities of the public works department. Discussion was held concerning the public works master plan. Discussion was held concerning the need for roof repairs at the armory, brick street repair/replacement, and Highway 36 repairs. Driggs will be on vacation November 30 – December 3.
- GEOCORE  
2<sup>nd</sup> & G ST Moved by Innes, seconded by James, to authorize the mayor to sign the agreement with Geocore for a monitoring well on G Street near the alley between 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> streets. Voting Aye: ALL. Opposed: NONE.
- DISASTER FEMA officials will be meeting with Driggs and Chance November 22<sup>nd</sup>.
- AQUATIC  
CENTER Discussion was held concerning repairs needed for the jets in the therapy pool at the seating section.
- VEHICLES It was the consensus of the Council to authorize the purchase of 2 vehicles for the public works department at a cost of no more than \$50,000.
- POLICY Discussion was held concerning the Councils duty to set policy for guidance and let supervisors make the decisions within the policy limits.
- JPPC Stites presented recommendations from the Joint Personnel Policy Committee (JPPC) concerning the employee recognition supper. JPPC recommended renting the Huck Boyd Center at a cost of \$90 and have Bon Appetit cater the meal for \$15 per plate with one entree or \$18 per plate with two entrée choices. A \$225 deposit for the meal will be required. It was the consensus of the Council to go with the \$18 per plate meal and approve the deposit be paid.
- The next JPPC meeting will be November 29<sup>th</sup>. Employees will be asked to vote for an employee to fill the vacancy on the committee prior to the next meeting.

A RESOLUTION FINDING THAT THE STRUCTURE LOCATED ON WEST 75' OF LOTS 7 AND 8, EXCEPT NORTH 20' OF LOT 8, BLOCK 3, RANGE 4, BISSELLS ADDITION TO THE CITY OF PHILLIPSBURG, KANSAS, COMMONLY KNOWN AS 400 THIRD STREET, PHILLIPSBURG, KANSAS, IS NOT UNSAFE AND NOT DANGEROUS AND DIRECTING THE STRUCTURE BE REPAIRED AND THE PREMISES MADE SECURE.

WHEREAS, the Enforcing Officer of the City of Phillipsburg, Kansas, did on the 15th day of August, 2016, file with the governing body of said City a statement in writing that a certain structure, hereinafter described, was unsafe and dangerous; and

WHEREAS, the governing body did by Resolution dated the 6th day of September, 2016, fix the time and place of a hearing at which the owner, his or her agent, any lienholders of record and any occupant of such structure could appear and show cause why such structure should not be condemned and ordered repaired or demolished, and provided for giving notice thereof as provided by law; and

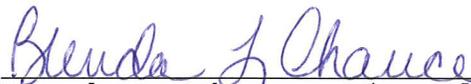

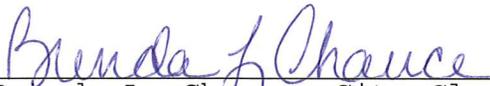

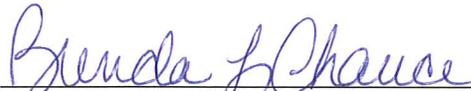
